**CSC 413 Mandatory Advising:** All undergraduate CS majors must receive 'midpoint' advising to gain admission to CSC 413. Instructions Starts. <b>ADD</b> ing courses with permission numbers begins.	August 27, Wednesday.
<b>ADD/DROP/AUDIT</b> deadline for <b>STUDENTS</b> (3 <sup>RD</sup> week) Dropped course will not appear on transcript. Permission numbers to ADD courses expire & cannot be used after this date.	September 17, Monday.
<b>CR/NC</b> deadline (8 <sup>TH</sup> week) ALL MAJOR COURSES MUST BE TAKEN FOR A LETTER GRADE	October 22, Monday.
<b>WITHDRAWAL</b> (serious & compelling justification) Students cannot exceed <u>18 units</u> of withdrawals. Also applies to requests for "retroactive withdrawals". If student has <u>withdrawn</u> from a course twice, a third withdrawal is not permitted. students must submit a transcript with their request for withdrawal to ensure this maximum is not exceeded.	September 18, Tuesday through November 17, Saturday.
<b>WITHDRAWAL</b> (serious& compelling/plus documentation). Above rules apply. <u>After December 17</u> , no withdrawals permitted.	November 18, Sunday through December 17, Monday.
<b>Instruction Ends</b>	December 17, Monday.
<b>Final Exams</b>	December 15 (Saturday), December 18-22 (Tuesday-Saturday); no exams on Dec. 16-17, (Sun-Mon).
