The scholarship will provide funding to students active in supporting women in computing, in organizations such as Society of Women Engineers, SFSU CSC Lean in Circle, SFSU's Promoting Inclusivity in Computing (PINC), or SFSU Women in Science and Engineering, pursuing undergraduate or graduate degrees (full-time) in Computer Science and Computer Engineering within the School of Engineering or Computer Science at SF State.

Applicants should be Computer Science and Computer Engineering majors, who are active in organizations and activities that support women in computing.

- Student must have a strong record of academic achievement and research engagement
- Domestic and international students are both eligible to apply.
